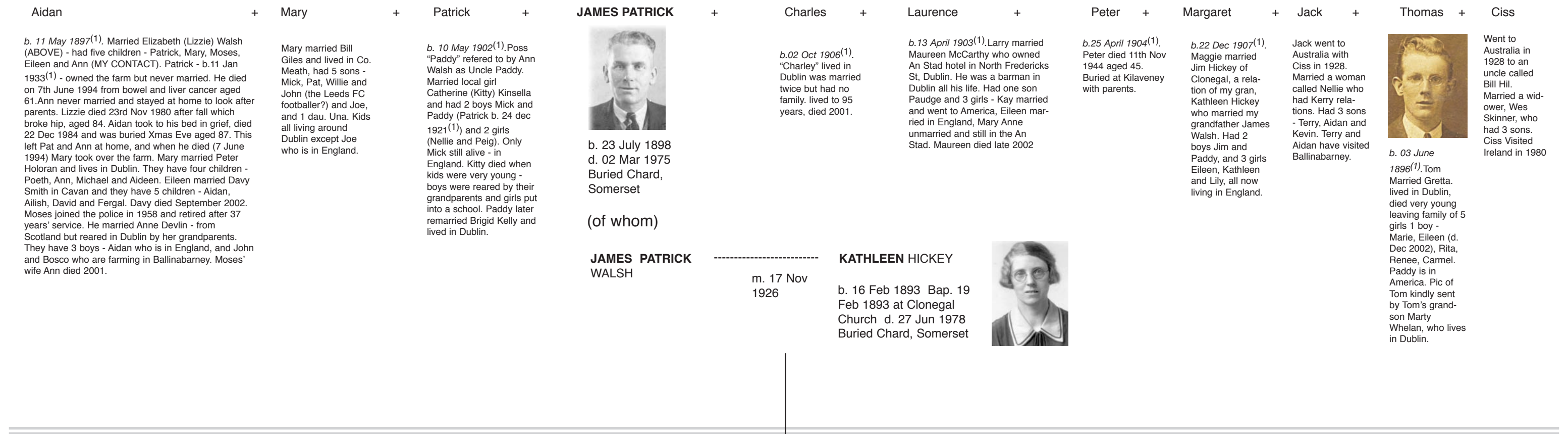
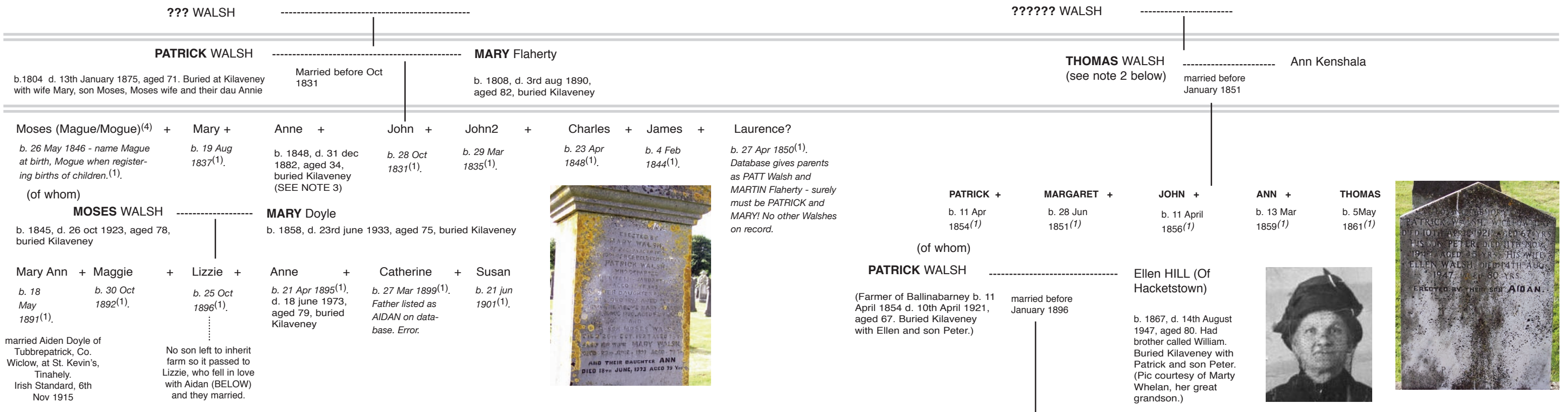


FAMILY OF JAMES WALSH OF BALLINABARNEY, CO. WICKLOW

NOTE 1) Taken from print-off supplied by Kilavenny parish priest Fr. Gahan in Dec 2005. Doesn't indicate if these are birth or baptism dates, but as the date given for James Walsh is his birthdate I've presumed these are birth dates.

NOTE 2) Griffiths Valuations for 1853 show a Thomas and a Patrick Walsh of Ballynabarney, Co Wexford - the only two Walshes listed for that area. Parish for both is given as Killoipe. Killoipe is some 20 miles north east of Ballynabarney, near Aughrim, Co. Wicklow, but this may have been the nearest Catholic parish in 1853. If this information does refer to ancestors, and the Patrick listed in Griffiths is the father of Moses then more than likely Thomas is the father of Patrick (married to Ellen). This appears to be confirmed by the parish records of Walshes born in Kilavenny between 1831 and 1867 supplied to me by Kilavenny PP Fr Gahan in Dec 2005. Only one Pat listed, and he was born in 1854, the date indicated from his age on his gravestone. Unfortunately the database names his father as JOHN, wife of Ann Kenshala, though this is an obvious error, as the records show a THOMAS Walsh and Ann Kenshala having a number of other children around this date. The witness on Patrick's birth details is a JOHN Walsh, so this seems likely to have been a transposition in recording the details.

NOTE 3) Kilavenny parish database does not confirm Ann's birth as 1848. Only one Ann recorded - born on 17 Jan 1842 to Patrick Walsh and Mary HERTY (surely a corruption of FLAHERTY?). Another inconsistency is the birth of a child MARGARET to Patrick Walsh and Mary HEGHEDY (another corruption?), given as 5 Nov 1837 - impossible as Patrick and Mary had a child Mary in the Aug of that year. As their next child Ann didn't arrive until 1842 - five years later, my guess is that Margaret was born in a year between 1837 and 1842. Mary Flaherty's name seems to deteriorate as the years progress - FLAHERTY, FLATERTY, FLATERY, HAGHEDY, and finally HERTY.

NOTE 4) Mogue [Maodhog] (m) A pet form of Aidan given to St Aidan of Ferns (died 626). The name was adopted into Welsh as Madog. In Ireland it was anglicised as Aidan by Protestants, and Moses by Catholics.
